Last Week of Term Procedures

Following on from the letter from the Local Authority sent to you on Tuesday via Parentapp, just to confirm from Monday 19th July, we will still be operating our same procedures in school regarding bubbles, hygiene routines, staggered times and face coverings, until we finish on Thursday 22nd July.

May I thank you in advance for your support with this. We have, with your support, throughout the pandemic, done everything we can keep our children, staff and community safe. We are continuing to be cautious, especially so that we can all enjoy the last four days of school. We, like yourselves, want to ensure that the children don't miss out on the end of term activities.
