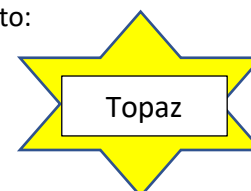

This week Reverend Hugh joined us for assembly on Monday, introducing spring clocks going forward. The clocks move forward by 1 hour this Sunday morning,

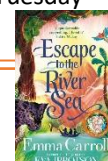


Book Fair:
