

Nursery Turtles have enjoyed looking at pictures of different types of houses and homes. The children created some beautiful pictures of their own house.



Reception Penguins have been discussing what makes a good friend this week and putting our ideas into practice! We've had lots of kind gestures within the classroom as a result! We have been working really hard at our name writing and we are improving every day. We had a wonderful music lesson with Mrs Walton, using instruments to make our very own Reception Penguin's Orchestra!



Year 1 Dolphins have investigated a range of historical artefacts to find out about the past and particularly enjoyed exploring old toys comparing them to some of their current favourites. In Maths they have been learning about number lines; one more one less. We have been reading 'Lost and Found' by Oliver Jeffers and created pet profiles for lost animals.



Year 2 Pandas have been learning about local significant people this week. They decided that they would like to find out more about the Beatles, particularly Sir Paul McCartney and John Lennon. They learned lots of facts and enjoyed listening to their music. Some of the children already knew some of their songs which was really nice as they were able to share this with others.



Year 3 Leopards have been working very hard to finish our topic of place value this week, next week we will be starting our new topic of addition and subtraction. On Thursday we celebrated International Peace Day by creating our own peace posters to celebrate the day.



Year 4 Jaguars have had a great week in class learning about four figure grid references and map reading. We have also begun our Lego Club which got off to a great start with a Space Theme!



Year 5 Tigers have been working hard this week, they have made paper origami doves, positive fortune tellers and also created an acrostic poem to share what peace means to them.



Year 6 Lions, this week have been continuing to work hard on our Place Value topic in Maths, we will be moving onto our new topic Addition and Subtraction next week! The children have also written some fantastic diary entries and listened to music that was played in French cafes in the 1940's to help us imagine the scene and inspire our writing.
