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# **Class Curriculum Information**

This week Nursery Turtles shared the story 'The Rainbow Fish'. The children enjoyed looking at shiny materials. They also talked about how to be a good friend.



Reception Penguins have been exploring Autumn this week. We have been looking at Woodland Animals and how they are different to our pets at home. In Maths we have been looking at the composition of 3 through 'The 3 Little Bears.' We have enjoyed playing 'Fred Talk' games to practice our oral blending.



This week in Year 1 Dolphins we have explored life in the 1950's and compared it to our lives today. In English we have created Missing posters using descriptive language. In Maths we have continued to explore fact families. In Art we have explored famous artists and created our own bright colourful flower paintings in the style of Van Gogh.



This week, Year 2 Pandas have answered questions about our fieldwork activity which was to collect data from outside school. The children observed the different vehicles travelling past and then presented the data into a bar chart. Also this week, they have enjoyed sketching different artwork from various artists.



This week in Year 3 Jaguars we finished our class book 'Seal Surfer' the children enjoyed writing their own letters to grandad, well done everyone! The children also completed their own research focusing on the Stone Age by creating our own information booklets and posters! Next week we will be researching the Bronze Age.



This week, Year 4 Jaguars have been working on writing their own books inspired by Gorilla. We will be putting them in our class library initially, then the children will be bringing them home at the end of the term.



Year 5 Tigers have been busy writing their wonderful final pieces of writing based on our class novel 'Race to the Frozen North.' We have been working hard on our addition and subtraction problem solving skills in Maths and have enjoyed making parachutes from different materials in Science.



Year 6 Lions have been busy baking this week, part of our DT topic has been looking at processed food. We baked our own bread and compared it to processed bread, we all enjoyed the home-made bread the most! We have also had a visit from PC Hazel where she discussed some of the dangers associated with Bonfire Night and Halloween.
