This week Year 3 Leopards have enjoyed celebrating anti-bullying week by creating our own odd socks and making posters! The children have also been working hard practising their 3 and 4 times tables and creating our own narrative predictions based on our new class book 'Winters Child'.



Year 4 Jaguars have had a busy week learning about Diwali and working on lots of different activities for Anti-bullying week.



Year 5 Tigers have been busy writing similes and winter poetry this week based on their class book. We have been thinking of ways to be kind during Anti-Bullying Week, about who we can speak to if we are worried, and we took part in a BBC live lesson to understand how to recognise and respond to bullying behaviour.



Year 6 Lions have been using persuasive language this week to write fantastic letters trying to persuade people to listen to their viewpoints and rethink their plans.
