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Class Curriculum Information

This week Nursery Turtles have enjoyed talking about everything we have learned during our topic 'Dangerous Dinosaurs'. We have been practising our counting forwards and backwards to 5. The children have been comparing groups of objects and saying which has more. What a busy week in Nursery.



Reception Penguins have been busy making Easter crafts this week, we've shown fantastic creativity. In Maths, we've continued looking at number bonds to 10 and have begun to write number sentences.



Year 1 Dolphins have had a glorious week. In Maths the children have been learning about measuring and used rulers to measure in centimetres. In English we have continued to read Beegu and considered his feelings at different parts of the story. In Art they have been exploring material and created some colourful prints using different tools. In Science they have been investigating temperatures at different times of the day. They had fun planting tiny cress seeds and have taken care of them each day whilst watching them grow. We have sent them home today for them to share with you at home.



Year 2 Pandas have had a fantastic week. They have continued reading Major Glad, Major Dizzy and are thoroughly enjoying the story which features lots of toys from the past. Based on this they have written some instructions on how to make a London peg soldier. The children then made the wooden soldiers themselves which they really enjoyed. In Geography the children have completed their innovative challenge which was to create their own coastal town for tourists. They used what they learned throughout our topic which helped them to decide which physical and human features to include in their town.



This week in Year 3 Leopards we have really enjoyed our swimming lessons, we have been focusing on how to stay safe in the water and are beginning to develop a range of strokes including front crawl using floats to support us! We are really looking forward to going swimming again next week. We have also enjoyed a visit from Knowsley CLC where we focused on data and creating our own pictograms, bar charts and tally charts using the iPads.



Year 4 Jaguars have loved learning to swim this week and are making great progress! We are also enjoying investigating soil samples from around school in our Geography lessons.



This week in English Year 5 Tigers have been writing about astronaut Chris Hadfield and in Maths we have been working hard on fractions and decimals. In Geography we have traced the journey of coffee from field to cup and looked at the problems some coffee farmers face in the developing world.



Year 6 Lions have had a very busy week working hard on their tests and applying their knowledge very well. They have also enjoyed taking part in World Poetry Day, creating some great poems using personification and similes. In P.E. Year 6 have continued to develop their basketball skills using dribbling, passing and control .




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
