It has been lovely to welcome back all Nursery Turtles this week, including 3 new friends! The children have been very excited by our new topic 'Sunshine and Sunflowers'. They have been introduced to different minibeasts and we have started to learn about the four seasons.



Reception Penguin's have been learning about 3D shapes and we are becoming experts in their properties. We have been practicing our independent writing skills and have 'wowed' Mrs Wills at their ability to 'hold a sentence'. We are really enjoying our new topic 'Sunshine and Sunflowers'.



We have had a wonderful first week back in Year 1 Dolphin's. The children have written their own stories about a character that has landed on Earth. In Maths they have been learning about volume and mass. In Geography they have been comparing features of cities around the world, including Kuala Lumpa. In Art they have been learning about printing techniques and created their own collagraphs. In DT they have researched moving vehicles, designed and created their own model.



This week Year 2 Pandas have begun reading a book by Emily Gravett called Tidy. Over the next few weeks, the children will do some English work around this book. Also this week the children have created a timeline of all English and British Monarchs from Alfred the Great house of Anglo-Saxon to King Charles III house of Windsor.



This week in Year 3 Leopards the children have enjoyed starting their new history topic of Emperors and Empires. KV Leopards were able to make a timeline of key events in the Roman Empire and then able to use non-fiction texts to research everyday life in Ancient Rome. We have also been busy starting our new English topic, which focuses on an Adventure story 'Journey' which I am sure the children will enjoy!



Year 4 Jaguars have been busy working on their times tables this week to prepare for the Multiplication Tables Check after half term. We have been enjoying our TT Rockstars challenges in class and we can also access this at home too!




Year 5 Tigers have made a great start to the Summer Term. We have begun our new History topic -Groundbreaking Greeks- and worked incredibly hard on our Maths topic all about calculating area and perimeter. In English we have been enjoying reading 'Coral Reefs' and 'The Brilliant Deep' and in Music we enjoyed learning to sing partner songs and to sing in rounds.



Year 6 Lions have been working very hard this week completing revision activities in preparation for their SATs. We have also started our science topic, Evolution and Inheritance researching the Five Kingdoms, and discovering the many living things in our world including bacteria and microorganisms. We have created a timeline to represent the British Wars from the Norman Conquest in 1066 to World War 2 in 1939 to start our History topic for this term - Britain at War.

The Family Center was introduced by Snapchat in August 2022 to enhance Snapchats safeguarding element when it comes to teen accounts.

Snapchat states that their users must be over the age of 13 years, but we know that this does not necessarily mean that the users are over 13.

The family center allows a teen user account and a parental user account to be linked. This allows the parental account to view their teens friends, see who they are messaging (you cannot see content of those messages).

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
.... SNAP

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Do you know who your children are **speaking to** on Snapchat?

Their "best friends" will be who they speak to the most. But any of their contacts can see their "stories" and message them.

Make sure they only add or accept people **they know**.



"My Eyes Only" is a section of Snapchat where you can save stories or images which are **locked by a passcode** set by the user.

These images are only visable when the passcode is entered, the passcode cannot be recovered by Snapchat.

Investgations have highlighted this is the section where children are saving and storing indecent images of themselves, or other children.

It is <u>illegal</u> to take, possess or share indecent images' of anyone under age of 18 - Including yourself $\langle \times \rangle$
