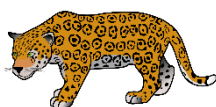
We have had a wonderful week of learning in Year 1 Dolphins. In English we have started to explore the story 'Lost and Found'. In Maths the children have been learning to sort objects and subitise, I would recommend the app '1 Min Maths' to support this learning at home. In History the children have started a new project about 'Childhood' where they will learn about changes of time and explore the 1950's. In Art they have had fun mixing paints learning about primary and secondary colours. The children have continued with their daily phonics, thank you for your support with reading at home. Friday homework will be shared via Seesaw.



Year 2 Pandas have had a fantastic start to Year 2 and are all working very hard. The children are thoroughly enjoying their English work on trolls. We have been reading *Troll Swap* and writing instructions on how to be a good troll. This week, the class also enjoyed learning the names of the seven continents and exploring them using an atlas.



This week in Year 3 Leopards the children enjoyed identifying human and physical features in geography during our topic of One Planet, Our World! In our P.E. lesson the children were able to practise their dribbling skills in hockey, next week we will be focusing on passing. We also enjoyed identifying which food belongs in each food group in our science topic human nutrition and the skeletal system.



Year 4 Jaguars have made a great start to the year! They are really enjoying our new Ready, Steady Read curriculum and have learned all about France, Italy, The Netherlands, Norway and Finland this week.



Year 5 Tigers have settled in brilliantly over the past two weeks and Ms Rowe is already super proud of each and every member of the class. This week, we have been reading extracts from 'Wonder' and answering questions about the various characters we've encountered. In Maths, we have been learning about place value and in science we investigated gravity by conducting 3 different tests. In Art, the children have been looking at impressionist paintings and learning how to mix a palette of colours using tints, tones and shades.



Year 6 Lions have enjoyed their first full week in Year 6, we have worked very hard developing our reading skills and have developed our choral skills too. In maths we have been using place value to help us with our calculations and have also been refreshing our times tables skills with daily practice. We have started our new topic of Maafa in history, also researching an African country, their flag, population, landscape and climate and in art we have used paint to create tints, tones and shades.
