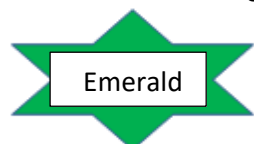

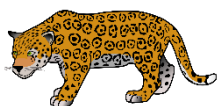
We have had a busy week of learning in Year 1 Dolphins. In Geography the children were introduced to maps, atlas and Google Earth. They were delighted to investigate a treasure map which led them to our outdoor allotment with tasty fruit. In Maths the children have been learning to use the symbols <, > and =. In Science the children have been identifying the numbers of parts on the human body. In Art they have been exploring mixing paint colours using rollers and making prints. Thank you for your support with phonics at home.



Year 2 Pandas have had another brilliant week and are all working hard. They have continued reading *Troll Swap* and have written letters in role as a character from the story. In Geography, they have been exploring a map of Whitby and learning how to read key symbols. The children have also been very creative, producing a range of Autumn-inspired artwork.



This week in Year 3 Leopards, the children have been busy writing letters to Ben inspired by our class book *Seal Surfer*. In maths, we finished our place value topic with an end-of-unit assessment. In science this week we had lots of fun discovering the different bones in the body and labelling these on a skeleton, well done everyone.



Year 4 Jaguars have loved learning about Milan in their Ready, Steady, Read lessons this week! It would be a great idea if they could also watch the movie versions over the weekend and they can discuss their learning with you.



This week, Year 5 Tigers have been reading Irish folktales and writing about the Northern Lights. In DT we began our new topic by looking at pneumatic power using balloons and syringes and in Science we investigated friction with toy cars and ramps. It's been a fun and very busy week!



Year 6 Lions have been working very hard this week, we have moved to our next topic in maths, addition, subtraction, multiplication and division, and have focused this week on adding and subtracting larger numbers. We have also enjoyed our reading, looking at 'The final Year' a lyrical story about school life. In art we have created some wonderful Autumn paintings and sketches which we are all very proud of.
