

Class Curriculum Information

This week Nursery Turtles have been working hard to recognise and trace their own first name. We have continued to enjoy the story 'Lost and Found', we have been thinking about how to be a good friend. This week the children discovered what happens when red, yellow and blue paints are mixed together! The children have been able to continue, copy and re-create repeating colour patterns.



This week Reception Penguins have learned the following sounds during RWInc Phonics sessions - v, y, w and z. In maths the children have been sorting objects according to length. We have continued to enjoy the story 'Lost and Found', we have been thinking about how to be a good friend. This week the children discovered what happens when red, yellow and blue paints are mixed together! The children have been able to continue, copy and re-create repeating colour patterns.



We have another fun-filled week of learning in Year 1 Dolphins. This week the children have been learning in Maths how to do part-whole models and write number sentences. In Geography they have been learning about different continents and oceans. In English they have planned their own story. In Science they have been identifying similarities and differences in humans.



Year 2 Pandas have had a wonderful week! They have been exploring different historical explorers and recognising how exploration has changed over time. The children have shown great enthusiasm and are very keen to find out more about Christopher Columbus and Neil Armstrong next week. In Maths, the children have continued developing their understanding of place value, focusing this week on using mathematical symbols to compare numbers — identifying which are greater and which are fewer.



Year 3 Leopards have worked hard this week continuing our topic of addition and subtraction in maths by practising subtracting crossing 10s and 100s. We enjoyed our geography lesson where we used the eight points on a compass to locate places on a map! During our English lessons the children enjoyed planning and beginning our final letters to Grandad from our class book 'Seal Surfer



Year 4 Jaguars have enjoyed learning all about their teeth in our Science lesson this week. We also had a fun lesson, learning all about the Anglo-Saxon invasion in History. We had great acting from the children when they took on the roles of the different groups involved in the invasion.



This week, in Science, Year 5 Tigers have been learning about air resistance and making parachutes to test their predictions. In Maths, we have been working on becoming masters of addition and subtraction and in English, we have been writing our final diary entries as Matthew Henson -the first man to reach the North Pole and a fabulous Black History Month role model. In our 'Ready, Steady, Read' lessons we have been reading 'Secrets of a Sun King' by Emma Carrol and the children have been showing off their super knowledge of Egypt.



Year 6 Lions have had a great week, in science we have really enjoyed creating our own blood samples in an experiment to see the different components of blood using different liquids. We have also been writing diary entries in the style of the two characters from our class book 'Star of Fear, Star of Hope' and enjoying sharing these with the class. In art we have created a landscape piece using perspective and shade to create a feeling of depth in our work.
