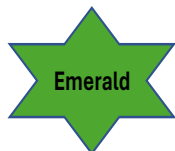

This week Nursery Turtles have enjoyed playing matching games, developing their turn taking skills. The children have enjoyed using props in a Tuff Tray to re-tell the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. They have been able to order pictures and objects according to size.



This week Reception Penguins have been focussing on the following sounds during RWInc Phonics sessions - c, k, u, b, f and e. The children are working hard on sounding and blending and reading words. In maths the children have been practicing counting from 1-20, please encourage your child to do this at home. The children have enjoyed using props in a Tuff Tray to re-tell the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. They have been able to order pictures and objects according to size.



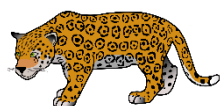
We have had an eventful week in Year 1 Dolphins. The children have joined in with anti-bully week activities; they created their own list of kindness and then we used the app Suno to create our own class song which we have shared via Seesaw. In Maths the children have been learning to subtract by crossing out. In Geography they have been learning about features of a settlement. In Science they have started a new topic about materials. All of the children had fun today joining in with 'Children in Need' activities. Thank you for your support.



This week, Year 2 Pandas have been working hard! In English, the children have written brilliant descriptions of London in 1666, using the mastery keys they learned last half term. In Geography, they finished their *Explore the World* topic by comparing Somalia to the UK, looking at both the human and physical features of each. In Maths, they have continued learning about addition and subtraction, focusing on making 10 first and using their knowledge of number bonds to 10. The children have also taken part in a range of activities to mark Anti-Bullying Week.



This week in Year 3 Leopards we started our new class book *Winters Child*, the class worked in groups to create a dialogue between two characters. During our geography lesson we enjoyed using Atlases to locate capital cities around Europe and plot these on our own maps! We also enjoyed celebrating Anti-Bullying Week by creating posters, letters and kindness postcards.



Year 4 Jaguars have enjoyed a busy week in school! We have participated in a Live Lesson online for Anti-Bullying week and had a visit from the Mental Health Nurse to talk about friendships. We wore Odd Socks and enjoyed the Altru Drama visit too. In Science, we have had great fun using online sound meters to measure decibels.



This week, Year 5 Tigers have been writing similes and expanded noun phrases to describe the witch in our class book. They've created some fabulously scary imagery! In Maths, we have multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000. In PHSE, we have been thinking about self-care and practising yoga and mindfulness. We completed a BBC Live Lesson for Anti-Bullying Week alongside a whole host of other activities!



Year 6 Lions have had an exciting week. In reading, we explored extracts from the famous diary of Anne Frank, learning more about her time spent in hiding and the challenges faced by so many families like hers. In maths, we continued our fractions topic, focusing on multiplying and dividing mixed numbers by whole numbers and applying this knowledge to problem-solving activities. We also enjoyed our acting role during the Altru Drama performance, waving our flowers at just the right moment and listening carefully for our cue!
